## CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

OF

## THE FEDERATION OF ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY AND SPECTROSCOPY SOCIETIES

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated, under and pursuant to the provisions of the general corporation law of the State of Delaware do hereby certify as follows:

FIRST: The name of the Corporation is

THE FEDERATION OF ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY AND SPECTROSCOPY SOCIETIES

SECOND: The address of the registered office of the Corporation is 900 Market Street, in the City of Wilmington, New Castle County and State of Delaware, and the registered agent thereof is Arthur W. Koffenberger, Jr.

THIRD: The period of duration of said Corporation shall be perpetual.

FOURTH: The purposes for which the corporation is organized are to further and advance the profession of Analytical Chemistry and Spectroscopy by providing a national forum in which concerned and involved representatives of academic, industry, and governmental institutions can participate and cooperate in the study and organization of the diversified disciplines and technologies that are required to solve modern day complex analytical problems; and to encourage and assist students, faculty members and all others interested or involved in the advancement of analytical chemistry and spectroscopy, including the granting of fellowships and scholarships; and to provide a forum to which papers and other matters pertaining to the profession of analytical chemistry and spectroscopy can be presented and including thereto disseminated literature and materials pertaining thereto.

FIFTH: In the accomplishment of said purposes, but without restriction thereof, the Corporation shall be authorized to print, publish, distribute, buy and sell books, magazines, papers, periodicals and supplies of all kinds and types; to organize, sponsor, operate and conduct meetings, programs, conferences, and events; to establish, maintain operate and assist other organizations of similar purposes; and to engage in such other activities as may be necessary or desirable in the accomplishment of the aforesaid purposes, Frovided that said objects and purposes shall be conducted within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) in such manner that no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to any director, officer, or other private person, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof. Provided, further, that, notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

The assets of the Corporation, having been dedicated and utilized exclusively for the purpose of promoting and developing the study and dissemination of information pertaining to analytical chemistry and spectroscopy, in the event of liquidation, dissolution or winding up by the operation of law, any disposition made of the assets of the Corporation after their application to the satisfaction of all legal obligations shall be such as is calculated exclusively:

- (a) To cary out the objectives and purposes for which the Corporation is formed and/or
- (b) To carry out similar or related objectives and purposes.

SIXTH: No capital stock will ever be issued, no dividends shall ever be paid, and the Corporation shall be operated on a nonprofit basis in furtherance of its corporate purposes and any surplus which occurs shall be used to further such purposes.

SEVENTH: The conditions and regulations of membership and the rights or other privileges of the classes of members shall be determined and fixed by the By-Laws.

such director may be entitled, under any By-law, agreement, vote of Board of Directors or otherwise.


